
Will lonely Maya's wish for a friend come true when she borrows Dazzle, a toy unicorn, from the library? What about Dazzle's wish for a place to belong?

## Dazzle Makes a Wish

- In chapter one, Dazzle makes a wish. But Dazzle's wish doesn't come true. Can you think of a wish you made that didn't come true? How did that make you feel?
- The Book Buddies talk about playing pretend. Nugget believes "anything is possible when you pretend" (page 17), but Homer thinks that playing pretend "doesn't change the facts. It doesn't change who we are inside" (page 16). Who do you agree with and why?
- How did you feel when Isabelle damaged Maya's toys? Has a similar situation ever happened to you? How did you resolve it?



- In chapter nine, why was it important for Maya to say no to Isabelle?
- Dazzle's wish "had come true in a surprise way. His hard start had turned into a happy ending" (page 66). Have you ever wished for something that came true in an unexpected way?
