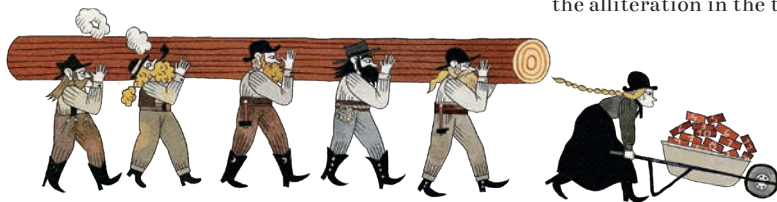
There are many fun and interesting words in the story. Here are twenty to share with your students:
